

Step into Sugar Hill's blossoming downtown and you'll be greeted by a growing skyline and plenty of opportunities to "live the sweet life."

The E Center is the heart of downtown and features a variety of options for entertainment, dining, and shopping, as well as a community gym and the gorgeous Eagle Theatre. Nearby, The Bowl amphitheater (voted Best Concert Venue in Gwinnett) offers 1,600 seats for concert-goers to enjoy unique, open-air performances from artists like The Commodores, Trace Adkins and Joan Jett & the Blackhearts. Sugar Hill boasts world-class parks, a scenic golf course and an active splash pad. It will also be home to the Sugar Hill Greenway, a 16-mile trail connecting parks, neighborhoods and greenspace throughout the city.

### **E CENTER**

With cascading water features, plenty of restaurants and boutiques, a microbrewery, the gorgeous Eagle Theatre and a community gym, the E Center truly has a little of everything for everyone! Explore the variety of options for entertainment, dining and shopping right in the heart of Sugar Hill.

### THE SUITE SPOT

In the center of downtown, The Suite Spot Business Incubator (suitespotsugarhill.com) offers the perfect space for co-working or an office, as well as programming and support from business development partners.

## **SHINE DISTRICT**

The sweet city's downtown entertainment area is affectionately known as the SHINE District: Sugar Hill's Intersection of Neighborhoods and Entertainment. A nod to the history of moonshining on the nearby Chattahoochee, SHINE District visitors can enjoy alcoholic beverages purchased from downtown businesses indoors or outside while exploring the growing downtown.





### **BROADSTONE**

Broadstone Sugar Hill is a mixed-used development with around 300 luxury apartments fronting West Broad Street in downtown Sugar Hill. The \$78-million direct private investment includes 4,600 sq. ft. of restaurant space, a community park and two street-level units that will house the Sugar Hill Arts Commission gallery and the Sugar Hill Historic Preservation Society's museum.

### **THE BOWER**

The Bower, a \$46 million, mixed-use private investment project, brings just under 300 residential housing units to Sugar Hill's Central Business District as well as additional retail space and residential amenities.
